

Breast Cancer in Young Women (PYNK) Fellowship

Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in Toronto is offering a 2 –year clinical and research fellowship starting July 1, 2010 to physicians who have completed training in medical, surgical, gynecological or radiation oncology. PYNK is the only program in Canada specifically devoted to fulfilling the unique clinical, research, and educational needs of women under 40 with breast cancer. The fellow will be responsible for seeing the majority of the new consults and learn to formulate and implement an appropriate treatment plan for each patient. The fellow will also run the PYNK follow-up clinic together with the nurse co-ordinator of the program, for patients who have completed chemotherapy and radiation, thereby acquiring expertise in managing the long-term problems of these patients including sexual dysfunction, excessive menopausal symptoms, and child-bearing issues. The fellow will also be expected to carry out a clinical or laboratory-based research study relevant to this patient population. Supervisors can be chosen from more than 20 different clinicians and researchers on the interdisciplinary advisory board.
